The accreditation will commence on **01 January 2010** and, unless notified in writing by the Environment Agency, will remain valid until **31 December 2010**.

**You are reminded that ePRNs [ePERNs] must not be issued for more than the total amount of packaging waste which is received for reprocessing or exporting. Any ePRNs [ePERNs] issued contrary to this are invalid and may not be accepted as evidence of compliance if presented by a Producer or Scheme.**

**Conditions of accreditation**

You must comply with the following conditions of accreditation. Failure to do so may lead to enforcement action.

- (1) The conditions set out in Schedule 5 of the Regulations
- (2) The following site specific conditions:
  1. In order to issue evidence for materials reprocessed in an EU or OECD country you must provide evidence of the country of destination and it must be approved before issuing any evidence.
  2. In order to issue evidence for material reprocessed in a Non OECD country, you must submit a Part C, including broadly equivalent evidence (where applicable) and have it approved before you can issue ePERNs on any materials exported. Evidence can be issued from the date your accreditation was approved. You must provide the information required and the reprocessor must be approved before issuing any evidence.
  3. Evidence for material reprocessed in an EU or OECD country may be backdated to the date your accreditation was approved.

## Suspension or cancellation of accreditation

The Agency reserves the right to suspend or cancel accreditation if you:

- (1) fail to comply with the conditions of accreditation.
- (2) knowingly supplied false information in your application for accreditation.
- (3) knowingly supply false information in connection with your compliance with the conditions of accreditation.

If your accreditation is suspended or cancelled, you will be notified in writing and we will update the public register. In the case of suspensions, we will also provide details of any remedial action which may be required to re-instate the accreditation.
